#### YMCA:

#### • Free Childcare:

- ALL YMCA locations are offering childcare for children of first responders, essential workers and children of families who were displaced, evacuated or lost property, or who cannot attend school because their school has closed for the day.
- o This program is being offered at no-cost.
- o Children must be at least 4 years and 9 months old to attend the program and must be in grades TK-8th.
- Space is limited. Contact afterschool@ymcaLA.org to learn more and sign up.

### • Free Access for Teens:

- All operating Y's have open their doors for teens ages 12-18\* years old. For more information, call or stop by your local YMCA center.

## **Transportation:**

- Big Blue Bus: :
  - Suspended fare collection for all riders \*\* Big Blue Bus will resume fare collection beginning on Tuesday, January 21
  - Offering a shuttle service to the Westwood Shelter; shuttle is located on Lincoln and Montanna and will pick up every hour on the hour until 9 PM
- Metro: Offering free rides all days
